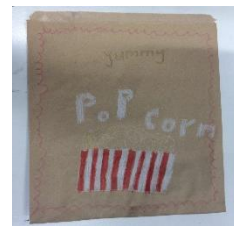


# Term Two Learning Overview: Readeville

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## INQUIRY

This term our inquiry will be integrated through science and geography. Our main focus will be exploring where our food comes from.

## MATHS

This term, we will be building on our counting strategies and looking at shape and linear measurement. Our investigations into number will also include skip counting and patterns, ordering numbers and naming and writing numbers.

## ENGLISH

### Reading and Viewing

- Guided reading opportunities.
- Continue with buddy reading.
- Weekly library borrowing.
- Exploring reading comprehension strategies.
- Read to Self book boxes.
- Literacy rotations incorporating reading, spelling and writing.

### Writing Genres:

- Narrative - investigating characters - character description.
- Procedure.

### Speaking and Listening

- Questioning and answering.
- Maths Monster sharing.
- Class discussions.

### Spelling/Word Study/Grammar:

Students will be exposed to various spelling features including vowel digraphs, alternative spellings of vowel sounds, short vowels and consonant blends.

**Grammar:** Children will deepen their understanding of grammatical concepts such as full stops, capital letters, plurals, vowels, adjectives, verbs and nouns.

## HOMEWORK EXPECTATIONS

Nightly homework for Reade students should take up to 10 minutes and could include these activities:

- \* Reading from a reader or another book.
- \* Practising reading sight words.
